A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the department of health to make available emergency contraception at its health centers, health stations, health clinics or other

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health facilities.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. The administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding a new section 17-184

to read as follows:

§ 17-184. Availability of emergency contraception. The department shall make available emergency

contraception at each health center, health station, health clinic or other health facility operated or maintained

by the department which also offers services relating to the diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted

diseases. For purposes of this section, the term "emergency contraception" shall mean one or more prescription

drugs, used separately or in combination, to be administered to or self-administered by a patient in a dosage and

manner intended to prevent pregnancy when used within a medically recommended amount of time following

sexual intercourse and dispensed for that purpose in accordance with professional standards of practice, and

which has been found safe and effective for such use by the United States food and drug administration.

§2. Effective date. This local law shall take effect one hundred twenty days after its enactment.
