Whereas, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Marchi, S.6155-A, and Assembly Member Abbate, et al, A.9722-A, "AN ACT to amend the general municipal law and the retirement and social security law, in relation to benefits for employees of governmental entities performing peace officer services in the city of New York, who are injured in the performance of their duties "; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it
