A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to extending the statute of limitations period for appealing a Board of Standards and Appeals decision

## Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision a of section 25-207 of the administrative code of the city of New York is hereby amended to read as follows:

a. Petition. Any person or persons[,] jointly or severally aggrieved by any decision of the board may present to

the supreme court a petition duly verified, setting forth that such decision is illegal, in whole or in part,

specifying the grounds of the illegality. Such petition must be presented to a justice of the supreme court or at a

special term of the supreme court within four months [thirty days] after the filing of the decision in the office of

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the board.

§ 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.
