A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the Department of Consumer Affairs to communicate electronically, in addition to regular mail, where an electronic mail address is provided by a licensee

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Section 20-107 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding new

subdivisions d as follows:

d. Every application for a license or the renewal of an existing license shall provide an opportunity for

the applicant to include an electronic mail address. Copies of every written communication sent by the

department to the applicant by mail including, but not limited to, notices relating to the renewal, suspension, or

revocation of a license, shall be sent electronically to such applicant if such applicant provides the department

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with an electronic mail address.

§ 2. This local law takes effect 120 days after it becomes law.
