Whereas, Pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, the Council has evaluated

the appropriate criteria to determine the environmental significance of Proposed Int. No. 813-A, amending the

Administrative Code of the City of New York, in relation to authorizing the commissioner of consumer affairs

to require that the engines of sight-seeing buses comply with emission standards as a condition of licensing.
