Whereas, a bill has been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Smith, S.2342, "AN ACT authorizing the city of New York to reconvey its interest in certain real property acquired by in rem tax foreclosure in the borough of Queens to former owner George Pullin, notwithstanding expiration of the two year period within which application may be made to the city to release its interest in property thus acquired"; and
