State Legislation Resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass a bill introduced by Assembly Member M. Cohen, A.7197, "AN ACT prohibiting the establishment of a green light speed progression sequence or timing rates for the changing of traffic signals to facilitate motorists' traveling in excess of the posted speed limit on Queens boulevard".

Whereas, a bill has been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Assembly Member M. Cohen, A.7197, "AN ACT prohibiting the establishment of a green light speed progression sequence or timing rates for the changing of traffic signals to facilitate motorists' traveling in excess of the posted speed limit on Queens boulevard"; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Council of the City of New York, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of New York, does hereby request the New York State Legislature to enact into law the aforesaid pending bill.
