State Legislation Resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass bills introduced by Senator Stafford, S.3782, and by Committee on Rules, A.8362, "AN ACT to amend the general city law and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to taxation of calls from public pay telephones".

Whereas, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Stafford, S.3782, and by Committee on Rules, A.8362, "AN ACT to amend the general city law and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to taxation of calls from public pay telephones"; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Council of the City of New York, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of New York, does hereby request the New York State Legislature to enact into law the aforesaid pending bills.
