WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation filed with the Council on February 22, 2002 its approval of the petition of 176 8th Avenue Corp., d/b/a Nisos, for a revocable consent to establish, maintain and operate an unenclosed sidewalk café located at 176 Eighth Avenue, Borough of Manhattan (the "Petition"), pursuant to Section 20-226 of the New York City Administrative Code (the "Administrative Code");
