WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation filed with the Council on March 12, 2003 its approval of the petition of Nonna Restaurant Corp., d/b/a Roc Restaurant, for a revocable consent to establish, maintain and operate an unenclosed sidewalk café located at 190-A Duane Street, a/k/a 323-A Greenwich Street, Community District 1, Borough of Manhattan (the "Petition"), pursuant to Section 20-226 of the New York City Administrative Code (the "Administrative Code");
