WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission filed with the Council on July 20, 2004 its decision dated July 14, 2004 (the "Decision") on the application submitted pursuant to Section 197-c of the New York City Charter by the Administration for Children's Services and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services for an acquisition of property located at 197-14 119th Avenue (Block 12653, Lot 6), Community District 12, Borough of Queens (the "Site"), for continued use as an agency operated boarding home (ULURP No. C 040252 PQQ) (the "Application");

WHEREAS, the Decision is subject to review and action by the Council pursuant to Section 197-d(b)(2) and (3) of the City Charter;

WHEREAS, upon due notice, the Council held a public hearing on the Decision and Application on August 9, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the land use implications and other policy issues relating to the Decision and Application;

RESOLVED:

Pursuant to Section 197-d of the City Charter and on the basis of the Application and Decision, the Council approves the Decision with the modification that the lease term shall be for a period no longer than five (5) years.
