Resolution approving the petition for a revocable consent for an unenclosed small sidewalk café located at 696 Madison Avenue, Manhattan (20045643 TCM; L.U. No. 282).

WHEREAS, the Department of Consumer Affairs filed with the Council on September 22, 2004 its approval of the petition of 999 Restaurant Corp., d/b/a Nello's, Inc., for a revocable consent to establish, maintain and operate an unenclosed small sidewalk café located at 696 Madison Avenue, Community District 8, Borough of Manhattan (the "Petition"), pursuant to Section 20-226 of the New York City Administrative Code (the "Administrative Code");

WHEREAS, the Petition is subject to review by the Council pursuant to Section 20-226(g) of the Administrative Code;

WHEREAS, upon due notice, the Council held a public hearing on the Petition on October 19, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the land use implications and other policy issues relating to the Petition;
