State Legislation Resolution No. 92

State Legislation Resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass bills introduced by Senator Krueger, S.2339, and Assembly Member Grannis, A.0308, "AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to owner liability for failure of an operator to comply with certain traffic rules".

Whereas, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Krueger, S.2339, and Assembly Member Grannis, A.0308, "AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to owner liability for failure of an operator to comply with certain traffic rules"; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Council of the City of New York, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of New York, does hereby request the New York State Legislature to enact into law the aforesaid pending bills.
