Whereas, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Golden, S.3831, and Assembly Member Abbate, A.7300, "AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law, in relation to providing a three-quarters pay accidental disability pension for persons employed by the city of New York as urban park rangers and associate urban park rangers"; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it
