WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Commission filed with the Council on July 22, 2008 a copy of its designation dated July 15, 2008 (the "Designation"), of the George Cunningham Store, located at 173 Main Street, Community District 3, Borough of Staten Island, as a landmark and Block 8026, Lot 5, as its landmark site pursuant to Section 3020 of the New York City Charter;

WHEREAS, the Designation is subject to review by the Council pursuant to Section 3020 of the City Charter;

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission submitted to the Council on September 12, 2008 its report on the Designation dated September 20, 2008 (the "Report");

WHEREAS, upon due notice, the Council held a public hearing on the Designation on October 2, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the land use implications and other policy issues relating to the Designation;
