A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the availability of a computerized service to facilitate notification requirements pursuant to the pesticide neighbor notification law.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Chapter eleven of title seventeen of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding a new paragraph (4) to subdivision b of section 17-1102 to read as follows:

b. (4) The department of information technology and telecommunications, in consultation with the department of health and mental hygiene, shall make available on the New York city map portal a service by which a person or business performing commercial lawn application of a pesticide may identify and create mailing labels for all premises that abut the property on which such application shall be made. The department of information technology and telecommunications may charge a reasonable annual fee for administering and

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maintaining such service; provided, however, that such fee shall not exceed two hundred fifty dollars.

§ 2. This local law shall take effect one hundred eighty days after its enactment into law.
