A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the commissioner of consumer and worker protection to report on violations of fee limits committed by third-party food delivery services

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Subchapter 22 of chapter 5 of title 20 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding a new section 20-849 to read as follows:

§ 20-849 Reporting on violations. The commissioner shall publish on the department's website a list of all violations of this subchapter and any rules promulgated pursuant thereto. Such list also shall include any act or omission after June 2, 2020 that is known to the department and would have been a violation of any section under this subchapter, or any rule promulgated pursuant thereto, as if no limitation under subdivision c of

section 20-846 or subdivision b of section 20-847 was applicable. Such list shall include, but need not be limited to, the name of the third-party food delivery service that committed the violation or would-be violation, the date of the violation or would-be violation, the applicable section of law, all penalties assessed pursuant to subdivision b of section 20-848, and the borough where the violation occurred.

§ 2. This local law takes effect 30 days after it becomes law.
