A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the implementation of technology to allow traffic enforcement agents to issue idling tickets through their hand-held computers.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Chapter one of title 14 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by

adding a new section 14-118.3 to read as follows:

§14-118.3 Handheld computers. Handheld computers used by the department to enforce laws, rules

and regulations relating to parking violations shall be capable of issuing notices of violation alleging violations

of the engine idling restrictions of section 4-08 of the rules of the city of New York.

§2. This local law shall take effect ninety days after it is enacted.
