A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to making it a misdemeanor to serve process without a license.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Section §20-409.1 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York is amended to read as

follows:

§20-409.1 Violations and penalties. a. In addition to the penalties provided for in section 20-105 of

chapter 1 of this title, any person who, after notice and hearing, shall be found guilty of violating section 20-

403 of this subchapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a penalty of not less

than seven hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than three

months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

b. Not withstanding subsection a of this section, any [Any] person who, after notice and hearing shall

be found guilty of violating any provision of this subchapter, shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of chapter one of this title and shall be subject to a penalty of not less than seven hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars for each violation.
