A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the mayor's office of criminal justice to report on Multi-Agency Response to Community Hotspots operations

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 3 of title 9 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended by adding

a new section 9-307 to read as follows:

§ 9-307 Multi-agency response to community hotspots reporting. a. The office shall submit to the

council within 25 days of the end of each quarter and post to the office's website and the city's open data portal,

in a machine readable format, a report on Multi-Agency Response to Community Hotspots operations. Such

reports shall include:

1. Information on the number of inspections, aggregated citywide, as well as disaggregated by borough and council district;

2. The conduct or complaint that resulted in such inspections;

3. Information on the duration of inspections, including the time each inspection commences and the average time spent inside each establishment;

4. Any summonses issued, and the agencies responsible for such summonses; and

5. Information on establishment closures as a result of summonses issued pursuant to such inspections,

including the average duration of such closures.

b. No information that is otherwise required to be reported pursuant to this section shall be reported in a

manner that would violate any applicable provision of federal, state, or local law relating to the privacy of

information.

§ 2. This local law takes effect immediately.
